#### A Chance to Reclaim Our Democracy at Town Meeting

A resolution on the Town Warrant this year calls on our Congressional Representative and Senators to send a constitutional amendment to the states that would abolish "Corporate Personhood" and return our democracy, our elections, our communities back to America's human persons (We the People) and to reclaim our sovereign right to self-governance. It will be voted on, near the end of Town Meeting, which starts at 12:30 p.m., on April 28th.

Are the interests of "the People" being addressed in Washington? Many see that the interests of corporations and their lobbyists dominate in Washington. Since the Citizens United Supreme Court decision two years ago, these concerns have grown as we see the rapidly increasing flow of money into our electoral process from corporate interests, often anonymous. That ruling is the culmination of a long trend of court decisions that have given corporations more and more of the rights that the Constitution allocates just to people. Government cannot limit spending by corporations in any elections in our country unless this ruling is changed.

The chart (at right) shows the impact of this ruling on our political landscape:

Three months after the ruling an ABC News/Washington Post poll found that 80% of those polled oppose the Supreme Court ruling. This year, A February 17 poll from Suffolk University shows 81% of Massachusetts people opposed to the Citizens United ruling and unlimited corporate and union spending in elections. To date, 15 cities and towns in Massachusetts have passed a resolution calling for an amendment to this ruling. Boston, Lynn and, most recently, Newburyport are part of that count. Many others are considering passing resolutions. Corporations are not people. They are creations of the state. They initially were created, supervised, and conceptualized as quasi-public entities, "designed to serve a social function for the state." Now, their interest is increasingly and solely focused on making profits and satisfying shareholders. It is not their job to safeguard the overall wellbeing of our society, our education, our earth, etc.; that is the job of the People. To address this situation and to reclaim our democracy requires that Congress pass and send to the states a Constitutional amendment removing personhood rights that have been given to corporations through the courts. The resolution proposed in the Town Warrant this year asks that Congress send such an amendment to the states for ratification. Recently 11 Attorneys General from across the country (including Massachusetts) signed a letter calling for a 28th Amendment in order "to put the electoral process back where it belongs: in the hands of the people, not corporations."

Please attend Town Meeting and vote for this resolution and join people across our country who are working together to reclaim our democracy. It's a big job, but only We, the People, can do it! Submitted by Kathy Lique, 9 Ellsworth Rd.


Tickets will be sold for 15 minute readings, the first reading is \$25 and if you don't like what you hear, all additional readings are \$20.

On Sunday May 20th 2012 at 10:30am-2:00pm there will be the annual North Shore Arthritis Walk beginning at Lynch Park in Beverly, MA. For years the North Shore Arthritis Walk has helped raise awareness and funds to support research and educational programming for those living with arthritis. The Arthritis Walk is a family event that promotes walking as a health activity to maintain bone and joint health, reduces stress, and enhances general well-being. Our goal is to bring together those living with arthritis in the North Shore area, their families, friends and co-workers, to provide a community of help and hope. We also seek to increase public awareness about the disease; a disease whose impact on the quality of life is severely underestimated and can affect people of all ages, including children and young adults.

In addition to the walk route, the event includes a post walk party with food, entertainment, children's activities, awards and prizes, exhibit booths and much more. The North Shore Arthritis Walk is a "Welcome Wagger" event. That means that friendly dogs on leash are welcome to attend. Arthritis affects one in every five adult dogs in the U.S. and is one of the most common sources of chronic pain that veterinarians treat.
