

Olivia Woodford.

Her work is dedicated to bringing the sacred into people's lives through performances of "Women of the Bible." She has written and performs four One Woman Shows.

This will be Olivia's third appearance at NVC; earlier performances were "Faith: A Mother's Story" and "The Heart of the Cross."

All who attended were inspired and spellbound.

The beginning of Jesus' ministry is the focus of "Hearing the Call." It dramatizes the "calling" that three different women heard as the result of meeting Jesus.

Because Jesus was not yet known in Israel, these women had no frame of reference for how to respond to his teachings that were a radical departure from Jewish traditions.

Experience how they set aside well-established customs and preconceived ideas of God to receive what Jesus offered.

Join the widow Susanna on the shores of the Jordan with John the Baptist as Jesus comes to be baptized; Simon Peter's Mother-in-law as she is healed from her fever and is then present for healings later that evening; and discover how the choice to talk to a stranger forever altered the Woman at the Well.

Recently, the Nahant Village Church received a very generous bequest from the estate of the late Doris Fickbohm.

Doris was Carol's and my neighbor – living only two houses away, but much farther as the public rights-of-way are laid out here in Little Nahant.

Doris and her husband Henry lived at 39 Mills Terrace for many years, and they attended the Nahant Village Church from time to time. They did not have children. Henry passed away in 1995.

I recall meeting Doris only once, and I remember her as a pleasant and engaging woman. Doris was very active in the Nahant Garden Club and was an accomplished flower arranger, winning numerous awards over the years. She was a gracious hostess and liked to entertain in her Emerald Green sitting room, which faced the water.

Doris was born on August 18, 1910, and died on October 24, 2005, spending her last few years as a resident of the Jesmond Nursing Home.

I want to use this opportunity of Doris's remembering the Nahant Village Church in her will as an invitation to everyone in the Congregation to consider including NVC in our Planned Giving.
